In 1995 Mark designed the agency's current family reimbursement respite model, which has grown to be one of the largest in the country in terms of the number of families served and hours of respite provided. He helped facilitate the merger with Belle Center in 2012 to form Belle Children's Services of St. Louis Arc. A licensed clinical social worker, he holds a master's degree in Social Work from the George Warren Brown School of Social Work at Washington University.
