Capable Kids and Families®

A lending library of therapeutic toys and equipment for children, and support services and resources for parents. **111 CHILDREN**

Childgarden Early Childhood Education

Inclusive care and education at Central West End-based early childhood center. **130 CHILDREN**

Parents Learning Together

Parenting support and education for people who have disabilities and are raising children. **50 PARENTS AND 102 CHILDREN**

Prevention

Education and awareness aimed at reducing the incidence of fetal alcohol syndrome. **DIRECT EDUCATION TO 987 PEOPLE; BROADER REACH THROUGH MEDIA 2,188,720.**

Therapy Supports

Developmental, occupational, physical, and speech/language therapies performed at the child's home, school, or community partnerships. **326 CHILDREN**

Applied Behavior Analysis Therapy

Therapy to increase or decrease socially significant behaviors and to teach new skills. Therapy provided in the participant's home, school, community, or our center. **135 PEOPLE**

Early Start Denver Model

Intensive early intervention program that provides 1:1 therapy for children diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder. **15 CHILDREN**

Social Skills Groups

Programs that aim to help children and teens develop appropriate social behavior. **34 PEOPLE**

Counseling

Providing individual and group counseling to teenagers, adults, and their families. **85 PARTICIPANTS**

Family Education and Advocacy

Workshop series, networking opportunities, advocacy support, and other educational activities for families and participants. **383 (advocacy phone calls, resource library, and workshops)**

In-home Residential Support (Respite)

Short-term relief for families caring for a child or adult with a disability. Arc provides reimbursement services. **1187 FAMILIES**

Post-Secondary Education

SUCCEED, a two-year post-secondary residential program in partnership with UMSL. **24 PARTICIPANTS**

Resources and Referrals

Information connecting families to resources, including phone calls, email inquiries, and in-person meetings. **2,500**

Support Groups

Targeted support groups for Moms, Dads, Siblings, Transition-ages, caregivers of older adults, and others. **193 PARTICIPANTS**

Community Living

Helping individuals live independently with minimal support. **54 PEOPLE**

Employment Training

Support in attaining employment skills. Includes collaborating with school districts and summer programs to help students gain work experience through training programs in the community. **205 PARTICIPANTS**

Recreation

Sports Leagues; weekend and spring break camps; and active living programs for older adults. **864 PARTICIPANTS**

Socialization

Social activities such as dances, Book Club, art and cooking classes, Family Fun Nights, music therapy, children's Sibshops, and Community Meet-Ups. **746 PARTICIPANTS**

Supported Employment

Support to find and maintain paid employment; includes assessment, job coaching, job placement, and retention. **252 PARTICIPANTS**

Community Integration

Day program for adults to participate in their communities through volunteerism and recreation. **175 PARTICIPANTS**

Campus-Based

Support for people to live in homes located on a campus-like environment in west St. Louis County with 24-hour staffing. **75 RESIDENTS**

Community-Based

Support for people to live in apartments and homes in the community with 24-hour staffing if needed. **57 RESIDENTS**

In FY2016, The Arc...

- had 645 full- and part-time staff
- benefited from the services of 1,215 volunteers
- offered interactive learning opportunities for staff and volunteers including over 220 classroom training sessions.

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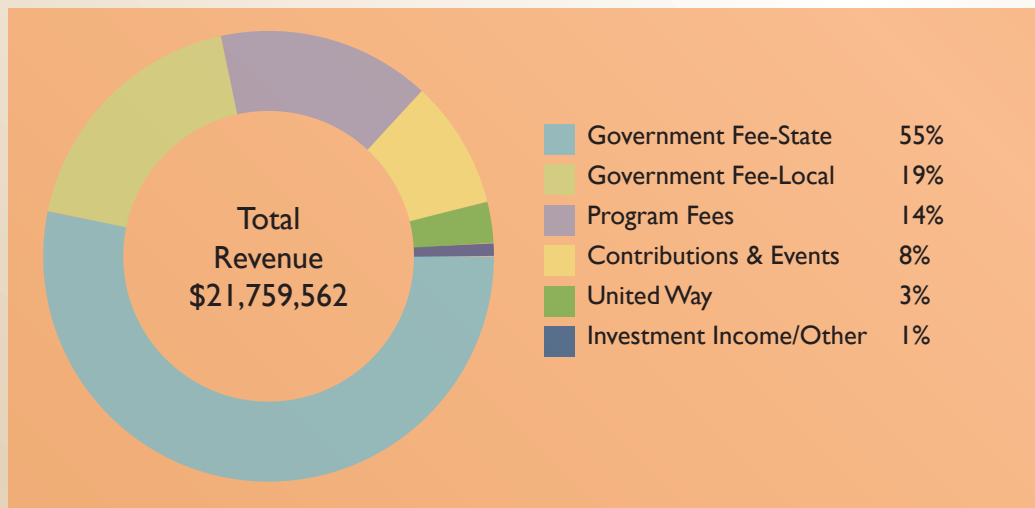
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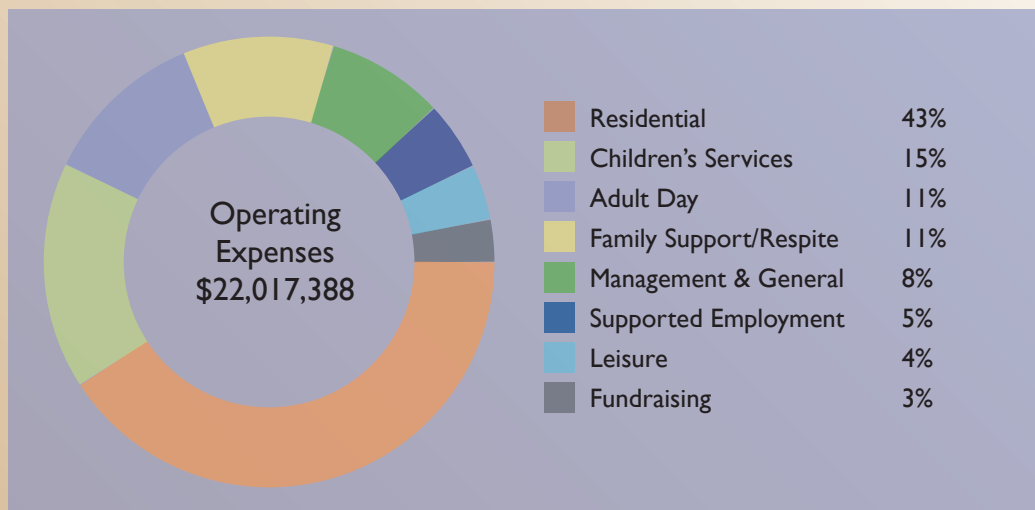

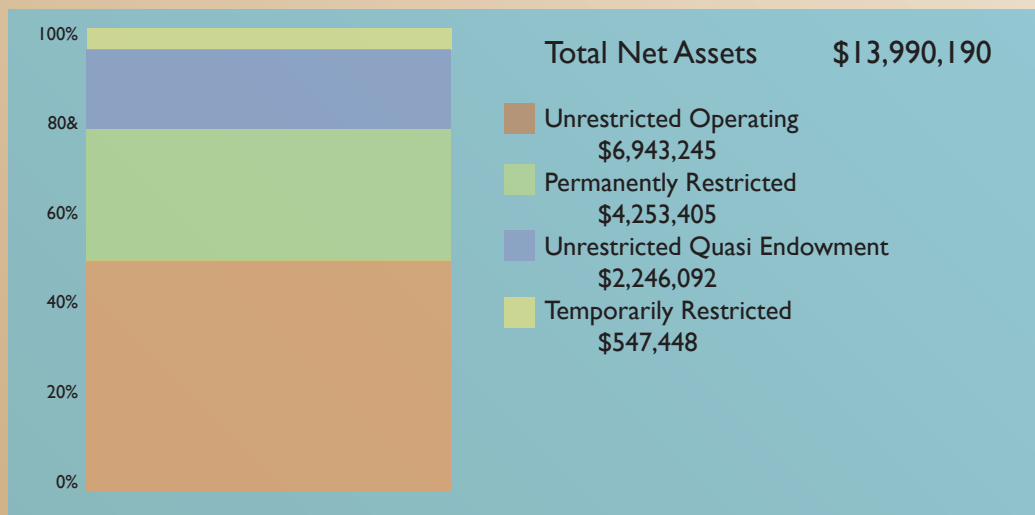
