Each lot has eight accessible parking spaces. If these spots are all in use, the next closest accessible parking spaces are located in the Forest Park Visitors' Center parking lot. The MO History museum is wheel chair accessible. The north (Lindell Blvd. side) entrance has ramps on both sides, and the south (Forest Park side) entrance has no elevation. Both entrances have power-assist automatic door openers.</p> <p>The Missouri History Museum has three levels, and all are accessible to the public. Two elevators, located near the south entrance, access all three levels.</p>	<p>Nursing and sensory friendly room is located on the Missouri History Museum's lower level, provides a calming space for visitors who may be feeling overwhelmed. It also functions as a private space for those who are nursing. Please note that this space is for individual use. Children must be accompanied by an adult.</p> <p>Sensory kits are available for free checkout at the welcome desk on the building's south side. The kits include noise-canceling headphones, anti-glare glasses, fidget toys, plush security blankets, and other items to support youth and adult visitors who have a variety of sensory needs. A state ID will be requested for checkout.</p>	<p>Audio Description of the Missouri History Museum for visitors who are blind or who have low vision is available on our website and SoundCloud. The playlist includes eight tracks that describe interior and exterior spaces, points of interest, and general way-finding information for the Missouri History Museum. There are also playlists for each of the Museum's special exhibits.</p>

Taylor Visitor Center. Motorized scooter rental is \$30. Service animals are welcome. Accessible parking spaces are located on both the east and west parking lots at the Garden's main entrance. Elevators are located at the Stephen and Peter Sachs Museum and the William T. Kemper Center. The Garden tram is manual wheelchair-accessible.</p>	<p>The Doris I. Schnuck Children's Garden is a place for families to discover, explore, pretend, observe, and have nature adventures together. A visit to this special garden offers a variety of sensory experiences that encourage socialization, motor skill development, and foster a love of the natural world. These pre-visit tools were developed to help make a child's experience a more meaningful and comfortable should they be living with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and other sensory disorders. A comfortable room for nursing moms and for young visitors who need a quiet space and relief from sensory stimulation. Located in Edward Jones Hall near the Brookings Exploration Center and Doris I. Schnuck Children's Garden, the room is purposefully designed with soft lighting, soothing colors, and comfortable seating. Calming activities in the room include books, tactile toys, plush forest critters, and soft mats. The room is available on a first come—first serve basis. Visitors in need of a less stimulating environment in the Garden are encouraged to visit the English Woodland Garden, Chinese Garden, Japanese Garden, Brookings Exploration Center before 10am and after 4pm, and the Children's Garden before 10am or after 2pm most afternoons.</p>	<p>The Zimmerman Sensory Garden features raised beds planted with multi-sensory plants just waiting to be touched and smelled. Each plant is labeled with Braille, raised letter, and large-print signage for visitors who are blind or visually impaired. The Garden for All in the William T. Kemper Center for Home Gardening highlights innovative ideas for individuals with physical disabilities.</p>

To reach the top and return, you must be able to manage at least 96 steps, divided into six flights, and you may need to stand for 30–60 minutes.</p>		<p>Hearing-impaired visitors may request assisted listening and captioning devices for the documentary movie and the museum from the Information Desk inside the Gateway Arch.</p> <p>Sight-impaired visitors may request audio description devices for the documentary movie from the Information Desk inside the Gateway Arch.</p>
